
Loving Individuals Offering Needed Services

99th Lions Club International Convention, Fukuoka, Japan

The 99th Lions Club Annual International Convention was held in Fukuoka City, Japan for five days, from June 24th through June 28th, 2016. Lionism started in Japan in 1952 and during the past 60 years the Lions Club International Convention was in Japan, once in Tokyo and once in Osaka.

Fukuoka City can be seen on the map directly below; it is located in the southwest part of Japan and is the largest commercial city in Kyushu. Its origin dates back to early 1400's when it was a prosperous trading port in East Asia.





As Lions across the world prepare for the 100th Anniversary of Lions Clubs International Organization, it is no surprise LCI President Chancellor Robert "Bob" Corlew would incorporate this theme in his presidential pin for 2016-2017 lion year (as shown above).



Fukuoka City is a pleasant balance of the old and the new culture of Japan. It is actually a combination of two cities; the port city of Hakata and a former castle town Fukuoka.

This city is the home of the oldest Zen temple in Japan and is well known for its gourmet food. Visitors can sample many types of food from local street vendors as they walk the city streets of Fukuoka City.

2016-2017 Lions Club International President



CHANCELLOR BOB CORLEW FIRST VICE PRESIDENT

Chancellor Bob Corlew, from Milton, Tennessee, USA, was elected to serve as first vice president of Lions Clubs International at the association's 98th International Convention held in Honolulu, Hawaii, USA, June 26 through 30, 2015.

Vice President Corlew is retired as chancellor for the State of Tennessee and a professor of law.

A member of the Murfreesboro Noon Lions Club since 1978, he has held many offices within the association, including charter club president, zone chairperson, district governor, cabinet secretary and council chairperson. He has been instrumental in the chartering of a number of new clubs. Most recently, he worked to charter a new club comprised of lawyers and judges, which gained more than 75 members during its first year.

In recognition of his service to the association, he has received numerous awards, including the Leadership Award, the Builder Key Award, three International President's Awards and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. He is also a Vanguard of the Melvin Jones Memorial, a Progressive Lindsey-Jennings Fellow and a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his Lions activities, Vice President Corlew has been active in the Boy Scouts of America, the Jaycees and the American Red Cross. He has also served as a councilman in Milton and was a Major in the U.S. Army Reserve.

Vice President Corlew and his wife, Dianne, also a Lion and a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, have five children and four grandchildren.

Official Notice 2016 International Convention, Fukuoka, Japan

The following proposed amendments to the International Constitution and By-Laws will be reported to the delegates for vote at the 2016 International Convention.

ITEM 1:A RESOLUTION TO REMOVE THE PROVISION RELATED TO THE EMERGENCY RESERVE FUND TO ALLOW FOR MORE FLEXIBILITY IN FUNDING PROGRAMS AND SERVICES. (THIS AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION REQUIRES A 2/3 VOTE TO ADOPT)

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, That, effective beginning with the 2016-2017 year, Article IX of the International Constitution shall be deleted in its entirety and the remaining Articles renumbered accordingly.

ITEM 2: A RESOLUTION TO REVISE THE

DESIGNATION OF ADMINISTRATIVE
OFFICERS. (THIS AMENDMENT TO THE
BY-LAWS REQUIRES A MAJORITY VOTE
TO ADOPT)

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, That, effective beginning with the 2016-2017 year, Article III, Section 3 of the International By-Laws shall be amended by deleting the phrase "senior executive administrator and/or executive administrator, treasurer and secretary, and such other" and replacing it with the term "administrative".

ITEM 3: A RESOLUTION TO RENAME THE
PUBLIC RELATIONS COMMITTEE TO
THE MARKETING COMMUNICATIONS
COMMITTEE. (THIS AMENDMENT TO
THE BY-LAWS REQUIRES A MAJORITY
VOTE TO ADOPT)

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, That Article IV, Section 1(i) of the International By-Laws shall be amended by deleting the phrase "Public Relations" and replacing it with the phrase "Marketing Communications".

The above Resolutions were voted on at the 99th Lions International Convention.

LCIF NEWSLETTER MAY 2016

What a great MD26 state convention. Donations for the Friday night silent auction was \$3,534.00, add the \$857.25 from tail twisting at the All Lions LCIF luncheon, other donations for a grand total of \$5,004.00 for LCIF. Add to this \$1,080.00 received for contributing member pins, measles pins, and undesignated donations for a total of \$6,084.00 forwarded to LCIF. I have received checks from clubs that are donating for the first time. I hope others have been sent directly to LCIF as we continue to raise the percentage of clubs in the multiple donating to LCIF. Over the next few years we continue to shoot for excellence with 100% club participation. It matters not just the amount but more importantly that **ALL** clubs participate.

There was over 240 lions attending the luncheon. Each of those attending had seven different pieces of LCIF informational material at their setting. Please use these to share with your clubs. I again want to emphasize that all donations go to the projects of LCIF with **NO ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES** taken out. Secondly, we can still get a \$1.00 matching donation to the measles campaign because of our alliance with other foundations.

LCIF has received its fourth consecutive four star rating from Charity Navigator. Why,

- 1. Because of efficient use of donations
- 2. Rigorous grant selection and monitoring
- 3. Transparency in all areas

These are all the more reasons to support LCIF your Foundation.

Finally, a personal message. Friday at the convention I noticed a cloudiness starting to cover my right eye. The cloudiness and loss of vision was complete Friday night at the emergency room. I was without vision in the eye from that time on. Monday after the convention retinal detachment was confirmed by a retinal specialist. The next Friday, one week after onset, surgery was performed. Sunday, May 8th, 48 hours after surgery very vague sight is beginning to come back. How complete is recovery to be will be known as time progresses. I only know that I will never be the same when I hear, read, and share stories about sudden onset of blindness.


